

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Information for families on Early Help

A Sure Start Children's Centre is a community resource providing a wide range of services for children and families in your local area. The aim is to improve the lives of children and their parents by bringing together early education, childcare, health, services for families and advice into the heart of their community.

Early Help - what's that all about?

All families may have a need for support at sometime or another and while most of the problems and concerns can be worked through within the family, some people may need a little extra help and support.

At times it can be hard to talk to family or fricabout stressful situations at home, so ye some assistance to make positive changes for you and your family. Our service belies you are the experts in your own family life. This is why we working in an open, honest and non-jude mental way, ensuring your views are respected and listen to; we also prefer to support you and your family in your own home.

casy! You can either talk to your new professionals involved with your family and they can for you. Alternatively, you can either drop in or ring your local Children's Centre (contact numbers available overleaf) for an informal chat with the family support team or a Family Service Manager.

OK that's easy enough, but what happens next...

A worker from the centre will contact you, and if we both feel that the children's centres can help and you'd like further support, we will then collect relevant information about your situation to make a plan together. This plan is called a Common Assessment Framework form (CAF).

Common Assessment Framework, what's that?

The CAF is a way of finding out what your child's needs are, well as what is working well. You and your child will take part in the assessment, your views will be listened to, and the needs of your child, as well as his or her strengths will be identified. An action plan will be agreed with you and your child that will ensure your family will get all of the help that you need.
