I have worked in a primary school for over 7 years in various roles, but my favourite role has always been working in the before and after school, so I am delighted to join Premier Education as the Manager of The Tree House Wraparound Club. I have qualifications in childcare, food hygiene, safeguarding and paediatric first aid

I would also like to introduce some of the staff that will be working alongside me. We have Marie and Jessica and we are also very lucky to have some of the fabulous Premier Education sports coaches joining us to run different sports activities at the after-school club. The Wraparound Club is Ofsted registered and we are available for all children from Reception to Year 6.

Times and prices per session: -

Breakfast Club 7.30am until 8.45am: £5 After School Club until 4.30pm: £5 After School Club until 6pm: £10.50

Breakfast Club: - Children will have the choice of cereals, toast, fruit, and fresh juice. They will also have a variety of activities and games set up for them to play with. At 8am we take the children outside for a physical activity before they go into class at 8.40am

After School Club: -Children will be collected from their classroom and brought to The Tree House room where they will have a free choice of daily crafts and a variety of games and learning activities from 3pm until 3.45pm. From 3.45pm until 4pm it will be snack time, where the children will be offered a healthy snack. We have a two-week rotational menu. We can also meet all children's dietary needs as required. At 4.15pm we will take the children outside or into the school hall for physical activities. If the children are staying until 6pm we will go back inside at 4.30pm for free play and then back outside or to the hall for additional physical activities from 5.30pm till 6pm

I am very excited to welcome as many children as possible and their families, to our Wraparound Club here at Vine Tree Primary School.

Free School Meals and Pupil Premium

This is just to remind parents that the Free School Meals entitlement still exists for all eligible families. Cheshire East Council will continue to award free school meals to the families that receive the qualifying incomes as outlined below, and whose children attend a Cheshire East school:-

- Income support (IS)
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA(IR)
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs) that does not exceed £16,190.
- Universal Credit with no earned income or with net monthly earnings less than £616.67
- If you have recently become unemployed or have reduced your working hours and have been granted the four week working tax credits.

You will be aware that school meals are free for all Key Stage 1 children, however we still require you to register your eligibility with Cheshire East.

Please note – it is very important that if you are entitled to free school meals, you register with Cheshire East even if your child does not wish to have a meal each day or is in Key Stage 1. We receive more funding as a school based on the number of children entitled to free school meals.

Pupil Premium

This is additional funding that your child's school can claim. It is available for any child who qualifies for free school meals due to their family income.

The money can be used by the school to help to provide more support to the children, to help develop children's academic progress, their self esteem or their social and emotional skills.

For each child registered, the school will receive:

- £1320 for pupils in reception through to Year 6.
- £300 for pupils where either parent is a serving member of the armed forces or has been in service during the child's education.

Collection of Children

Could you please ensure that if your child is being collected by somebody different at the end of the day that you have informed either the office, the child's childminder or your child's class teacher in the morning.

Attendance Procedures - Important Update

Please see below important information regarding term time holiday requests., taken from our school policy.

- The school will require parents to observe the school holidays as prescribed.
- The headteacher will be unable to authorise holidays during term-time.
- The headteacher will be only allowed to grant a leave of absence in exceptional circumstances. Applications will be made in advance and the headteacher will be satisfied by the evidence which is presented, before authorising term-time leave.
- The headteacher will determine the amount of time a pupil can be away from school during term-time.

 Any leave of absence is at the discretion of the headteacher.
- Any requests for leave during term-time will be considered on an individual basis and the pupil's previous attendance record will be considered.

Requests for leave will not be granted in the following circumstances:

- ⇒ Immediately before and during assessment periods
- ⇒ When a pupil's attendance record shows any unauthorised absence
- ⇒ Where a pupil's authorised absence record is already above 10 percent for any reason
- ⇒ Requests for leave in September
- ⇒ When the request for absence is made with less than 2 weeks' notice
- ⇒ When a child's absence is already below 97%
- ⇒ When the request for absence is not exceptional.

If parents take their child out of school during term-time without authorisation from the headteacher, they may be subject to sanctions such as penalty fines imposed by the Local Authority.

The imposition of fixed penalty fines for parents and carers taking children out of school in unauthorised circumstances will be imposed by the Local Authority and not the school. The penalties for unauthorised absence are detailed below.
